Our Road Map to Occupational Training

Process

- Attend Orientation/Information Session.
- Complete Customer Application and be determined eligible. (Proof of Age & Citizenship, Social Security Card, Proof of Family Income and Selective Service for all males 18 years and older)
- Complete an Assessment with a Case Manager and discuss job interests and training options.
- Prepare and take CASA test (Test of Adult Basic Education)
 - Reading and Math. (Approx. 3 hours).

Projected Employment Growth

Monmouth County:

Employment in Monmouth County is expected to increase well above the state's projected rate of growth. Healthcare and social services is expected to add the most jobs.

Projected Employment Growth

Middlesex County:

- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services

The professional, scientific, and technical services industry is expected to add the most jobs over the next 10 years. Healthcare and social services ranks second.

Mercer County:

- Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services
- Healthcare and Social Services
- Accommodation and Food Services (Leisure Hospitality & Retail)

The professional, scientific, and technical services is projected to experience the most employment growth. Health care, social services, and Leisure, Hospitality & Retail are also expected to have significant growth over the next 10 years.

On the Job Training (OJT)

- Individuals who are economically disadvantaged or dislocated in their job by a layoff may be eligible to receive an OJT grant. Our Business Services Representative works closely with prospective employees to match them with open positions throughout our business community.
- Employers are reimbursed for some of the costs associated with training the new employee.
- This program helps defray the cost of training new employees and gives eligible workers enhanced skills and permanent, full-time employment.
- The program is a cost effective way to staff positions with job-ready prescreened candidates.
- OJT programs are available for individuals who are in a Work First New Jersey program, unemployed, under employed and individuals who completed a training program and lack a job specific skill or experience.

Youth Services

- Our Youth Career Opportunity Program serves low-income and at-risk individuals ages 16 through 24.
- Eligible Out-of-School youth ages 16 to 24 can attain their high school diploma, gain requisite job skills to secure employment, enroll in occupational job training or post secondary education.
- Activities may include: education classes, career development activities, work readiness training, work experience, internship, and occupational training.

Tuition Waiver

What is tuition waiver?

• Tuition waivers enable eligible, unemployed customers to enroll, tuition free, in courses of instruction at public colleges and universities in New Jersey. These courses can only be attended if there are seats available; books, labs and other appropriate fees are the responsibility of the student.

How do I qualify for a tuition waiver?

- You must be registered with a <u>One-Stop Career Center.</u>
- You must be **unemployed** and permanently separated from your employer, or have received a layoff notice.
- You must be able to prove that you are currently not a student, have a two year, full-time work history, and are seeking full-time employment.
- You must choose a program of study in a <u>demand occupation</u> within a 50 mile radius of your home.
- You must be able to prove that you are not employable with your current level of skills and credentials. If you have skills and credentials in a demand occupation, you may not be eligible.
- You must plan to attend a public college or university in New Jersey.
- You must not have already paid tuition and must not be in default on your financial aid.
- You must be accepted to the public college or university you plan to attend.
- You must apply for <u>financial aid</u> online or mail a completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Financial Aid

Some Occupational Training/Certification programs are Pell Eligible.

• What is a Pell Grant?

- Federal *Pell grants* are need-based awards for low-income students. They do not have to be repaid as long as the student meets *program* requirements.
- Federal Pell Grants are limited to students with financial need, who have not earned their first bachelor's degree, or who are enrolled in certain post-baccalaureate programs, through participating institutions.

• Who is eligible?

• **Pell Grants** are awarded usually only to students who have not earned a bachelor's or a professional degree. To be **eligible for a Pell grant**, you must also meet the general federal student aid **eligibility requirements**.

Financial Aid/Pell Grant

- What can Pell grant money be used for?
- Federal student aid, including **Pell Grants**, **can** be **used** to cover a variety of costs, generally including: Tuition and fees normally assessed; Books, supplies, transportation, and miscellaneous personal expenses; Living expenses such as room and board.
- How to apply:
- You should start by submitting a <u>Free Application for Federal Student</u> Aid (FAFSA®) form
- You will need to know the school you are interested in enrolling to submit your completed application. Applicant should speak with the Education/Financial Aide Counselor at the school prior to completing the application.

A.B.T.

(Additional Benefits while in Training)

A.B.T is a State of New Jersey extension of your unemployment benefits to assist you while you are in an approved training program.

Eligibility

- Unemployment benefits have to be exhausted in order to receive A.B.T.
- A.B.T. can only be extended for the period of time you are in training, but not to exceed six
 (6) months.
- If you have been terminated (fired) or you have quit your job, you will NOT be eligible for A.B.T. **This is a NJ state law.** You have the right to appeal although this may not change the outcome for eligibility.
- You must be a fulltime student as defined below:
 - Undergraduates (at least 12 credits)
 - Graduate program students (at least 9 credits)
 - Summer college courses (minimum of 6 credits)
 - Certificate vocational program (attend a minimum of 20 hours per week)

Partner Agencies

Ocean County Veterans Services Bureau

- Services are available exclusively to veterans, widows and families of veterans, transitioning service members and their spouses.
- Work with a dedicated Veteran Representative who is trained to meet your specific needs and is familiar
 with the full range of job development services, including career planning, job searches and training
 programs.
- This service is available at no cost to eligible customers.

The Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services (DVRS)

- DVRS is here to help individuals with disabilities who are having trouble finding or holding a job because of their disability. If you have a disability that is preventing you from working, or is endangering your present employment, you may be eligible for services.
- DVRS can fund a training program and provide job search assistance for all eligible participants.

Mature Worker Services

Being a mature worker trying to get back into the workforce or change careers can be difficult. There are several opportunities and services dedicated to helping mature workers get the assistance and information they may need.

WorkForce 55+

- Is a federally-funded program committed to empowering economically disadvantaged seniors to achieve economic independence
 and control of their futures. The aim of Workforce 55+ is to help mature workers return to the workforce through an "earn while
 you learn" program.
- The program partners with community-based, nonprofit organizations and government agencies to provide participants with training to update their skills.
- Do I qualify?
- Are you 55 years of age or older?
- Are you seeking employment training?
- Are you currently unemployed?
- Are you living on a limited income?

NCOA (National Council of Aging)

NCOA offers support for Economic Security and Healthy aging as well as programs that provide training and employment

<u>Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP)</u> SCSEP matches eligible older, unemployed adults with part-time jobs for community service organizations. Participants build skills and self-confidence, while earning a modest income. For most, their SCSEP experience leads to permanent employment.
